# A FOND FAREWELL







With a small number gathered in the Church for Holy Communion on the 4<sup>th</sup> April and with many of our Parishioners and wider Community on the Live Stream, we said a fond farewell to **Reverend John Marchant** 

When John and Pat joined the Parish as Priest in Charge in 2013 - there was a lot to be done and there were some opinions at the time that St Matthews wouldn't have the resources to remain open and may have to close its doors. It was very clear however that he was not prepared to accept that fact.

In his time as Rector in St Matthews and together with a willing and able Select Vestry he oversaw some major changes and developments from the re-opening of the front doors after 40 years to the construction of the new Columbarium Wall for Parishioners and the Community. Also, there had been some difficult decisions to be made from time to time, but all in all he leaves the Irishtown & Donnybrook Union of Parishes in a very strong position for the future.

The Archbishop of Dublin commented recently when he visited the Parish to dedicate the new Columbarium Wall, he described John as tireless, responsive, industrious, helpful, courteous, outreaching and Godly!!

A Parishioner also added recently that "Without any fuss, you have re-modelled the church and the parish to make them a better fit for the community and it is such a shame you cannot stay longer". Also the Clergy in both St Patricks Ringsend and Star of the Sea Church have wished him well and complimented his work in the Community.

John was disappointed that one of the consequences of the Pandemic that he had not been able to Confirm 9 now past pupils of St Matthews School and it will now be with Zoom probably and the Archbishop to help them confirm their Christian beliefs.

St Matthews National School gave him an emotional farewell recently and that is clear testimony to the relationship that he had nurtured and strengthened greatly between the School and the Parish.

John was never afraid to say what was right for the good of both St Matthews and with St Mary's and when he set his mind to a project it was invariably achieved with willing acceptance.

St Matthews Church is without doubt a better place by his presence and service for both the Parish and the wider community and together with the assistance of Steve Griffiths and the Select Vestry he leaves the Parish with a clearly designed plan for the future for the next incumbent to help implement.

We also look forward to hopefully welcoming him to our Live Stream on some Sundays and we will be able to say that we have people attending our Service from places as far away as Bolton, Switzerland, New Zealand and as close as Ballinteer.

St Matthews will miss him greatly and we wish John and Pat many happy and healthy days in retirement from full time ministry and when we can hopefully have them back to the Parish to say a proper farewell.
